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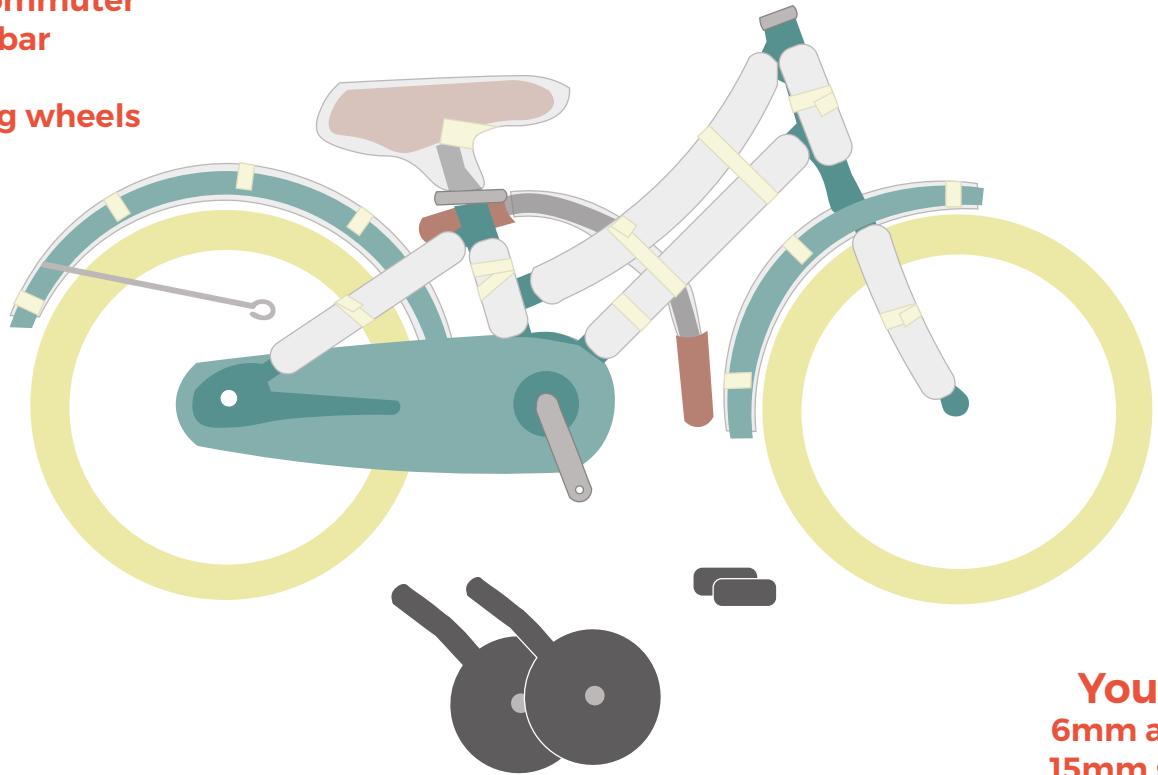

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Let's see what you've got.

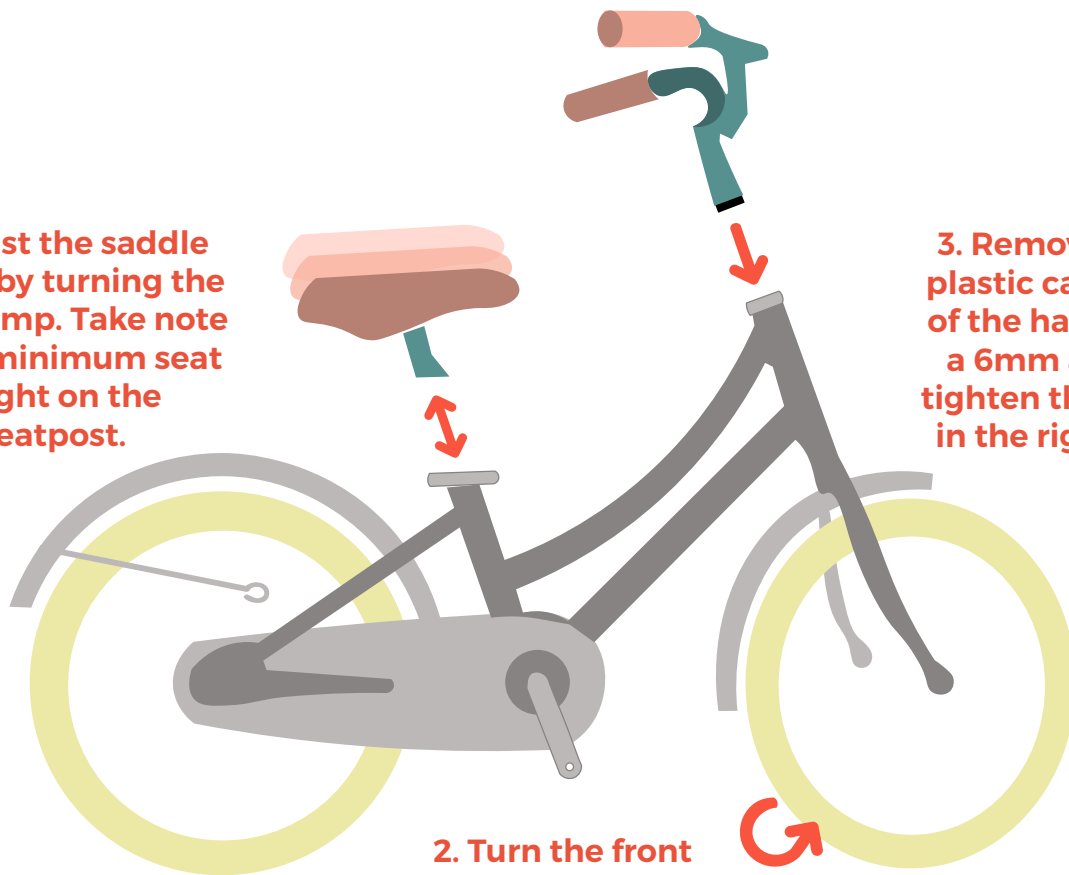
You have:

- 1 Mini Commuter
- 1 handlebar
- 1 saddle
- 2 training wheels
- 2 pedals



You need:
6mm allen key
15mm spanner
tyre pump

1. Adjust the saddle height by turning the seat clamp. Take note of the minimum seat height on the seatpost.



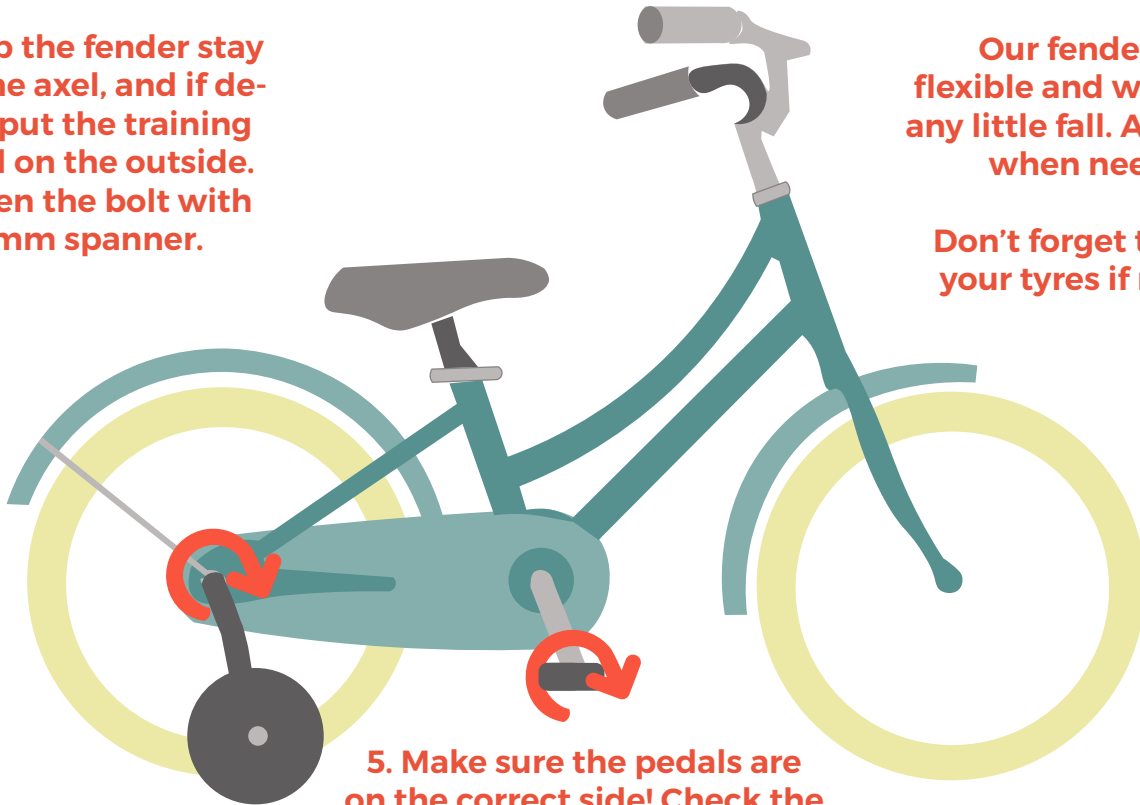
2. Turn the front wheel to have the brake facing forward.

3. Remove the black plastic cap at the end of the handlebar. Use a 6mm allen key to tighten the handlebar in the right position.

4. Loop the fender stay over the axel, and if desired put the training wheel on the outside. Tighten the bolt with 15mm spanner.

Our fenders are flexible and will survive any little fall. Align them when needed.

Don't forget to pump your tyres if needed!



5. Make sure the pedals are on the correct side! Check the sticker that indicates R (right) or L (left) . Tighten the pedals using a 15mm spanner.



All done. Time to go and explore the world!

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
